Hyperonim — accessories: cross-the-body bag (shoulder bag), backpack (backpack), handbag (ladies' handbag), purse (wallet), satchel (bag with a long handle for carrying books and papers), shoulder bag (bag with a long handle, for carrying over the shoulder), tote bag (large open bag with handles), wallet (wallet), babushka (scarf, scarf), balaclava (balaclava), bandana (bandana), beanie (beanie), beret (beret), boater (canoutier), bobble hat (pom-pom hat), bonnet (bonnet; bonnet), bowler hat (pod), cap (cap), cloche (hat) (cloche), fedora (fedora), headscarf (scarf), hood (hood), panama (panama), sou'wester (hat, which protects the face and neck from rain and wind), stetson (a wide-brimmed hat usually worn by residents of the western United States), stick pipe (cylinder), topper (cylinder), top hat (cylinder), tam o'shanter (tam-o-shanter - wide wool beret with a pompom on the top of the head), tam (tam - wide wool beret with a pompom on the top of the head), ten-gallon hat (cowboy hat), cowboy hat (cowboy hat), trilby (trilby), bolo tie (tie «bolo» - cowboy tie in the form of a leather lace with a decorative clip), bow-tie (butterfly tie), scarf (scarf), shawl (shawl), tie (tie), necktie (tie), gloves (gloves), mittens (nuts), muff (coupling), wristband (wristband), belt (belt), summerbund (suckle), suspenders (braces), braces (braces).

The hyperonym «accessories» is classified into hyponyms based on the following characteristics:

Bags: across-the-body bag, backpack, handbag, purse, satchel, shoulder bag, tote bag, wallet.

Headwear (headgear); babushka, balaclava, bandana, beanie, beret, boater, bobble hat, bonnet, bowler hat, cap, cloche (hat), fedora, headscarf, hood, panama, sou'wester, stetson, stove pipe, topper, top hat, tam o'shanter, tam, ten-gallon hat, cowboy hat, trilby.

Neck accessories (шейные аксессуары);

bolo tie, bow-tie, scarf (шарф), shawl, tie, necktie.

Hand accessories (gloves); gloves, mittens, muff, wristband.

Waistband (belt); belt, cummerbund, suspenders, braces.
